Concept Note

The rapid proliferation of digital technologies has ushered in a paradigm shift in the ways knowledge is produced, circulated, and interpreted across disciplines. These interdisciplinary engagements enable scholars to move beyond conventional modes of close reading towards data-driven and algorithmically assisted forms of analysis, while still retaining critical sensitivity to context, ideology, and aesthetics. At the same time, the rise of generative AI and machine learning compels a re-examination of creative agency, originality, and intellectual property within literary and linguistic production.

Technological advances have also reconfigured pedagogical practices in English Studies. Virtual learning environments, AI-assisted writing tools, and digital collaboration platforms are reshaping classroom dynamics, assessment strategies, and learner engagement. However, these developments are accompanied by critical concerns related to digital accessibility, ethical use of technology, and the persistence of global inequities in technological access.

This conference seeks to explore these multifaceted intersections by fostering interdisciplinary dialogue among scholars from literature, linguistics, media studies, cultural studies, computational fields, and other allied disciplines. It aims to critically examine how technological innovations can be meaningfully integrated into English Studies while preserving its humanistic core. By foregrounding both innovation and critical inquiry, the conference aspires to chart new directions that are intellectually rigorous, ethically grounded, and globally relevant.

Submission Guidelines

Abstract Submission

- Times New Roman, 12 Font Size
- Title of the abstract/paper should not exceed 15 words.
- Abstract of the paper should be in about 150 to 200 words with 5 to 6 keywords and your full institutional address.
- Originality: The abstract must be original and not submitted to any other conference/seminar.
- Avoid Repetition: Do not repeat the title of the abstract of your paper within the abstract.
- Submission mode: All abstracts should be submitted only online through the registration page.

Full Paper Submission (though not mandatory)

- Length: Full paper should be between 3000 to 5000 words including Works Cited section.
- Abstract: Each paper must include an abstract of about 150 words (not exceeding 200 words).
- Format: Use A4 size, 1-inch margins on all sides, single spacing, and 12-point, Times New Roman.
- Place all tables, figures, and illustrations within the text, not at the end.
- Citation: Use MLA Handbook 9th edition. Ensure accurate citation and referencing of all sources. Wherever applicable, include URLs for references.
- Originality: Submission must be original and must not have been published or submitted for publication elsewhere.
- All papers will be checked for plagiarism and AI report before acceptance for publication. Plagiarised or AI generated submissions will be rejected without review.
- Selected full papers that follow the guidelines will be published in the journals of WAAR (*Ars Artium* or *Akshara*) and/or edited volumes by a reputed publication house. Intimation of selected papers will be given post conference.
